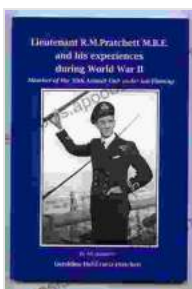


Lieutenant Pratchett And His Experiences During World War II: Member Of The 30th

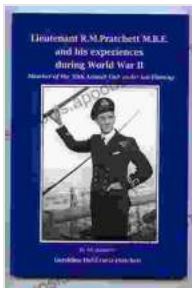
